All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Oaklawn Township, County of Greenville, about two miles, more or less from the Town of Pelzer, S. C. triangular in shape and containing 25 acres, more or less, and being known and designated as the western part of tract No. 2, of the property of Geo. W. Meares, according to plat thereof made by Wm. F. Lee, Surveyor, August, 1906, which plat is recorded in Plat Book "D", at Page 134, R. M. C. Office Greenville County, S. C. and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a stone in the line of property now or formerly of W. D. Davis, at the joint corner of tracts Nos. 1 and 2, property of Geo. W.
