Pike executed a Declaration of Trust, dated December 7, 1910, which is recorded in Deed Book PPP, at page 560, declaring that he held said property for his daughter, Iola Forest, for and during her natural life, then in trust to her children until the youngest child of her body should reach the age of twenty-one years, at which time the said property was to be conveyed by said Trustee, or his successor to be appointed by his last will, to said children. The said Iola Forest died intestate February 4, 1949, as will more fully fully appear in the office of the Probate Court for Greenville County in Apartment 67, File 6. The said Francis M.
