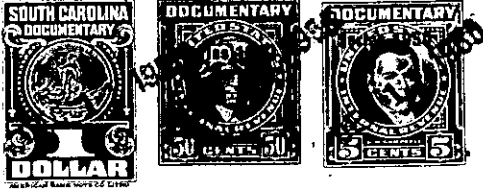

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That WE, Vantross Franklin, Elizabeth Calhoun, J. C. Franklin, Geo. C. Franklin, Benj. S. Franklin, Robert Franklin, Nannie F. Miller, Alice F. Land, Lula F. Pope

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of Two Hundred Thirty-four and no/100 (\$234.00) Dollars

to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Fleming Prince

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Fleming Prince

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Austin Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, near the Laurens Road, in the Laurel Creek section containing 2.34 acres, more or less, and being a portion of the lands owned by G. C. Franklin at the time of his death, intestate, some years ago. Said lot of land is more specifically described by courses and distances as follows:

BEGINNING on a pin in field at Young's corner and running thence N. 70 E. 4.00 to pin in Young's line; thence S. 15 E. 5.50 to stake; thence S. 71 1/2 W. 3.60 to stake in Ferguson's line; thence N. 33 W. 1.50 to stake at Washington's corner; thence N. 29 1/2 W. 1.28 to stake; thence N. 1 1/2 W. 3.20 to the beginning corner.

All private or plantation roads adjoining or passing through said lot of land shall remain open for the use and benefit of the owner of this and other properties of the grantors or their grantees.

G. C. Franklin died intestate several years ago owning this and other lands, and leaving as his sole heirs at law the grantors, who are his widow and children.
