WHEREAS, certain lands now standing in the name of W. G. and Annie R. Lollis was purchased in the year 1946 by the said W. G. and Annie R. Lollis from Iola George, one half of the consideration for said purchase having been paid by the said Mathew L. Lollis and,

WHEREAS, the grantors hereinafter mentioned do relinquish any interest to that portion of the lands above referred to retained by W. G. and Annie R. Lollis,

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That we, Houston Lollis, Truman Lollis, Raymond Lollis, Milton Lollis and Grace L. Owens, the heirs of Mathew L. Lollis, deceased, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar to them in hand paid by W. G. and Annie R. Lollis, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, do by these presents, renounce, release and quitclaim unto the said W. G. and Annie R. Lollis, their heirs and assigns, forever:

"All of their right, title and interest in and to that certain piece, parcel or tract of land lying in Oaklawn Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in School District 2-A, containing Forty-Five and 67/100 acres (45.67) more or less, and being known and identified as Tract No. 1 on a plat from a survey by J. Coke Smith, Surveyor, bearing date November 1950, and according to said plat being more particularly described as follows, to-wit: BEGINNING at a stone, the common corner of lands of Caldwell and lands of G. C. Clark; thence N 44-15 E 18-84 chains to a stone; thence N 4-00 E 4-86 chains to a point in the road; thence N 68-15 E 2-11 chains to a point; thence S 19-00 E 31-75 chains to a point; thence S 44-00 W 10-99 chains to a point; thence N 43-45 W 26-00 chains to the BEGINNING corner. This is a portion of the lands conveyed by Iola George to W. G. and Annie R. Lollis by deed dated November 11, 1946, of record in Book of Deeds 302, at page 116, in the office of the R.M.C. for Greenville County, South Carolina."
