WHEREAS, some controversy has arisen between George Shaleuly and J. R. Williams of Greenville County, South Carolina, regarding a road which enters the Shaleuly property and circles around his barn and back to Williams' property, and,

WHEREAS, George Shaleuly has agreed to cut, lay out and dedicate a new road crossing his property in practically a straight line into Williams property, thereby eliminating the old road around Shaleuly's barn and to pay one-half of the cost of the construction of the new road, and,

WHEREAS, after the newly dedicated road has been laid out and opened up, J. R. Williams agrees to abandon that portion of the old road around Shaleuly's barn and to pay one-half of the cost for the construction of the new road, and,

WHEREAS, the said J. R. Williams represents that this road leads and serves only his property.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and the mutual covenants contained herein, the said George Shaleuly does hereby dedicate for road purposes a strip of land across his property in practically a straight line leading to the Williams property and to the place on the Williams property where the road now runs, said strip to be eighteen (18) feet wide and to be used for road purposes by the said J. R. Williams and the public in general.

The said J. R. Williams hereby agrees to renounce and release any and all right which he might have in the present road curving around the barn of George Shaleuly and to abandon any claim to use said portion of the old road as a road and consents to same being closed. J. R. Williams further agrees to pay one-half of the cost of constructing the new right-of-way across the property of George Shaleuly and the other one-half to be paid by George Shaleuly as stated above.
