Rainey their heirs and assigns, forever: All my right, title and interest (the same being an undivided one-fifth interest) in and to all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State and County aforesaid, in the City of Greenville, State of South Carolina, designated as Lot No. 110 on a plat of Boyce's Addition, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C., in Plat Book "A", at page 383, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to wit:
