the life estates and conditions hereinafter set forth,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Oneal

Township,

County State of South Carolina, containing Thirteen and 08/100 (13.08) Acres, more or less, on Frohawk Creek, bounded by lands of Lee Burnett, Gordon Moon, W.I. Moore and Hodge, and being known as the home place of the said Arthur Zimmerman, and being the same property conveyed to Arthur Zimmerman by deed of Lee McMakin, recorded in Deed Book 21, page 102, and by deed of J.L. Burnett, recorded in Deed Book 83, page 114, R.M.C. Office for Greenville County.

The grantor herein expressly reserves unto himself a life estate in the property described, and also a life estate for his wife, Malissa Zimmerman, and also reserves the right for his sister, Bessie Z. Jackson, to reside in the home dwelling as long as she lives.

The said James McCullough is to have the right to cultivate the land, beginning as of this date, and is to pay a rental to the said Arthur Zimmerman of not less than \$100.00 annually and feedstuff for his cow during the lifetime of the said Arthur Zimmerman, and if the said Malissa Zimmerman survives her husband she is to receive the same rental for the remainder of her life. If the said Bessie Z. Jackson survives both Arthur Zimmerman and Malissa Zimmerman she is to receive the same rental for the remainder of her life.

The said James McCullough is to assume the responsibility of keeping the buildings in good repair, and to carry a reasonable amount of insurance thereon, and also to keep the taxes paid on the property.

If the said James McCullough fails to reasonably comply with the terms hereof he agrees to re-convey the property to the said Arthur Zimmerman, or to his widow if he fails to comply for her benefit.

If the said James McCullough should for any reason be unable to comply his wife may have the opportunity to carry out the terms hereof.
