A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 17th day of October, 1951, by and between BEN F. PERRY, of Greenville, South Carolina, herein called the "Owner", and THE SOUTH CAROLINA STATE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT, herein called "Highway Department".

W I T N E S S E T H :

WHEREAS, the Owner is vested with the fee simple title to a certain tract of land originally containing approximately 52 acres, bordering the Southwest edge of U. S. or State Route No. 25, between Greenville and Travelers Rest, S. C., known as the New Buncombe Road, bounded on the South by Langston Creek and on the North by Tindal Road, having acquired same from the heirs-at-law of W. M. Tindal, deceased, by general warranty deed as follows: (1) deed of E. Inman, Master, dated January 3, 1950, conveying an undivided 2/9ths interest, which deed is recorded in Deed Book 399, at page 215, R.M.C. Office for Greenville County; and (2) deed of Frances T. Tindal, et al, dated November 4, 1949, conveying an undivided 7/9ths interest, recorded in the said R.M.C. Office in Deed Book 399, at page 236; and

WHEREAS, the said W. M. Tindal died intestate on November 23, 1932, leaving as his sole surviving heirs-at-law and distributees the following:
