SOUTHERN RAILMAY COMPANY, a corporation organized and existing under CLUE FARRSWORTH and by virtue of the laws of the State of Virginia, hereinafter Mon convenience styled the Railway Company, party of the first part; and

GREATER GREETVILLE SELER DISTRICT COMMISSION, a corporation organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of South Carolina, hereinafter for convenience styled the Licensee, party of the second part;

<u>UITHESSBTH</u>:

THAT the RAILMAY COMPANY, for and in consideration of the covenants of the Licensee upon its part to be kept and performed, as hereinafter expressed, hereby gives and grants unto the Licensee, in so far as the Railway Company's present title enables it so to do, the right or license, determinable as hereinafter expressed, to construct and maintain a forty-two (42) inch cast iron sever pipe upon and across the right of way or property and under the tracks of the Railway Company, at a point 2839 feet southeast of the point of switch for track No. 143-13 in the main track of the Railway Company, at GREENVILLE, in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina; substantially as shown on print of Drawing No. A-11034, dated April 24, 1951, hereunto annexed and hereby made a part of this agreement; the location of said pipe upon and across the right of way or property of the Railway Company being indicated in red on said annexed print.

AND the LICENSEE hereby covenants and agrees in consideration of said license:

l. That in the installation and construction of said pipe upon and across the right of way or property and under the said tracks of the Railway Company, as aforesaid, the Licensee shall conform in all respects to plans and specifications shown and noted on said annowed print and such other specifications as may be prescribed by the Railway Company; it being understood that the work of constructing and maintaining said pipe shall be done at the sole cost and expense of the Licensee, and at all times during its progress be subject to
