Aiken deceased his life in the State of South Carolina, May, 1924, leaving in full force and effect his last will and testament, which is duly recorded in the Probate Court at Greenville County, South Carolina, in instrument No. 20, file No. 20, whereby all of his real estate was devised to his wife, Elvina Crane Aiken, for life, with remainder to his following named children, to-wit: J.L. Aiken, Ben F. Aiken, J. M. Aiken, W.P. Aiken, Samuel Aiken, Lula Aiken McDonald, Burton Aiken, and Henry Aiken; and when and the life tenancy, to-wit, Elvina Crane Aiken, the widow of the said J.J. Aiken, died on the 10th day of December, 1930; and thereafter her fee is now vested in the three named children of the late J.J. Aiken, all of whom are still living; and WHEREAS all of the heirs under the will are desirous of conveying their undivided interests to I. H. Philpot, J.W. Williams, and J. A. Wright, now therefore,

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, J.L. Aiken, Ben F. Aiken, J. M. Aiken, W.P. Aiken, Samuel Aiken, Lula Aiken McDonald, Burton Aiken, and Henry Aiken, of the County of Greenville, in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Thousand, Seven Hundred, Fifty (\$1,750.00) Dollars to us in hand paid by I. H. Philpot, J.W. Williams, and J.A. Wright (the receipt hereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do give, bargain, sell and release unto the said I.H. Philpot, J.W. Williams, and J.A. Wright, their heirs and assigns, forever:

All that certain piece, parcel or tract of land lying and being situated in State and County aforesaid, on the north road leading from Norwegian Cotton Mills to "The White Horse Inn," and a few hundred yards southeast of Cunningham's Store, and containing ten and eight-tenths (10.8) acres, more or less, and having the following rates and bounds, to-wit:

Beginning at a stake on said road and running thence along the same N. 26-15 E. 10.5° to stake; thence S. 57-05 W. 6.10 to stake on corner lands now or formerly Berry's; thence N. 10-30 W. 10.5° to stake corner lands now or formerly Cunningham's; thence N. 57 E. 11.5° to the beginning corner on said road, less than enclosing, however, the tract of land containing five (5) acres, heretofore conveyed by Mamie H. Fulmer to H.L. Huff, Jr. on the 2nd December 1922, recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Volume 60, page 11, containing 5.8 acres.

This is the same property conveyed to J. J. Aiken by deed from Mamie H. Fulmer, dated Aug. 26, 1924, and recorded in the R.M.C. Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 99, at page 420.
