in the State aforesaid, - - - - for - - - - and - - - - in consideration of the sum of Five (\$5.00) Dollars and love and affection for our mother

to us paid by Emma Page Mullinax

in the State aforesaid

have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release

unto the said Emma Page Mullinax, her heirs and assigns, forever:

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Oaklawn Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing two and one-half (2½) acres, more or less, being part of the T. E. Bennett land in Oaklawn Township on Highway No. 29, on or near Saluda River and near Piedmont and Northern Railroad, having the following mates and bounds to-wit:  
BEGINNING at I. P. in edge of Potton 45 feet from center of Highway No. 29; thence N. 73 3/4 E. 750 feet to I. P., this line along Albert Alexander; thence N. 38 1/4 E. 205.5 feet to center of Highway No. 29, along J. P. Adams; thence along center of Highway S. 58-5 W. 100 feet to bend; thence S. 53 W. 100 feet to bend; thence S. 5-5 W. 491.5 to point in Highway; thence S. L7-5 E. 45 feet to beginning corner.  
Bounded on North and East by J. P. Adams, on Southeast by Albert Alexander, on the Northwest by Highway No. 29, this being the same lot of land conveyed to Emma Page Mullinax by J. T. Bennett by his Deed dated March 8, 1944, recorded in R. I. C. Office for Greenville County in Volume 205, at page 412."

"All that piece, parcel or lot of land in Oaklawn Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, containing eleven (11) acres, more or less, described as follows: BEGINNING on the P. & N. Railroad trestle over center of Saluda River; thence along the center of said R. R. Track 3.80 chains toward Greenville, to stake; thence S. 72 3/4 West 15.20 to iron pin X.M.C.; thence N. 23 7/8 W. 0.70 to center of Highway; thence down the center of said Highway 13.70 to X in aforesaid river; thence down the said river to point of beginning, adjoining lands of estate of W. L. Bellorn, C. H. Bennett, Saluda River, also lands of J. T. Bennett, and being a part of that certain tract of land conveyed to J. T. Bennett by C. H. Bennett, T. C. Bennett and J. T. Bennett, Deed dated February 27, A. D. 1933, and recorded in Vol. 180, page 121, R. I. C. Office for Greenville County."
