KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, N. G. WALKER, of Polk County, State of North Carolina,

FIVE HUNDRED (\$500.00) Dollars

to me in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by R. C. Walker and Sallie Walker, his wife,

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said R. C. Walker and Sallie Walker

a one-half undivided interest in and to

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina

That certain tract of land lying and being situated in Greenville County, South Carolina, on the branch waters of Vaughn's Creek and waters of North Pacolet River:

BEGINNING on a dogwood (cut down) now a stone, and runs North 70 deg. West 22.38 chains to a dogwood marked 3X; thence South 37 1/2 deg. West 21.80 chains to a stone marked 3X; thence North 37 1/2 deg. East 24.50 chains to the beginning corner, containing 50 acres, more or less.

There is excepted from the above described land a tract containing 6 acres conveyed to Mrs. T. P. Watson by the heirs of Meredith Morgan.

Also that certain tract or parcel of land situated in Greenville County, State of South Carolina, lying on both sides of branch waters of Vaughn's Creek and waters of North Pacolet River adjoining the lands of Meredith Morgan, Decuth May Carruth and Theron Earle;

BEGINNING at a hickory, old corner, and running thence South 79 1/2 deg. East 5 chains to a dead chestnut; thence South 4 deg. East 21 1/2 chains to a stake in the road (Oak Grove); thence along said road to the original line near a rock; thence South 7 1/2 deg. West 15 chains to a pine above a road oak on A. D. Bowers' corner; thence South 21 1/2 deg. West 30 links to a stone; thence North 63 1/2 deg. West 17 chains to a stake; thence North 37 1/2 deg. East 24 1/2 chains to a rock; thence North 12 deg. East crossing Vaughn's Creek 11.8 chains to the beginning corner, containing 50 acres, more or less.
