Scruggs Subdivision as shown on the plat made by J.A. Adams, Surveyor and having the following metes and bounds; lot 18 having a 50 foot front on what is known as Cherry St. and running back or each side 200 feet in parallel lines and having a 50 foot back and sided by lots 17 and 19; lot 19 having a 50 foot front on Cherry St. and running back 100 feet next to lot 18 and 20; lot 20 having a 50 foot front on Cherry St. and running back in parallel lines 227 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. and having a 50 foot back and being bound by lots 18 and 19 corner.
