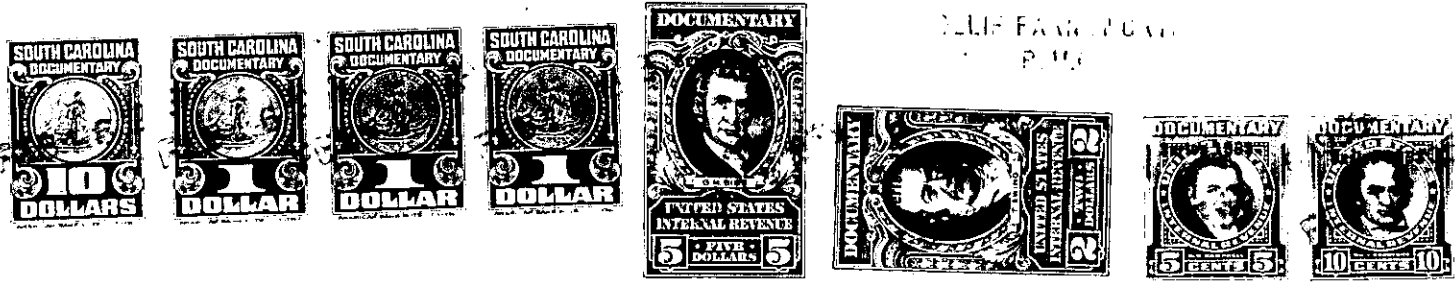

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Vernon Avery McJunkin and Frances E. McJunkin, their heirs and assigns

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in CHICK SPRINGS Township, GREENVILLE

County, State of South Carolina, adjoining Paris Mountain State Park, and having according to a survey made by J. J. Riddle, Surveyor, April 1, 1937, the following metes and bounds, to wit:

BEGINNING at a stake in the center of a road at corner of land now or formerly belonging to Charles W. McGee, Jr., and running thence along said McGee line S. 37 N. 1647 feet to a stake; thence S. 34-30 W. 381 feet to a concrete monument at corner of property of Paris Mountain Water Company; thence with line of said Paris Mountain Water Company N. 77-45 E. 1535 feet to a concrete monument on Holcombe line; thence with said Holcombe line, N. 0-54 W. 1084 feet to a stake in the center of road; thence with the center of said road, N. 52-45 W. 359 feet to the beginning corner.
