I am in receipt of your letter of August 19, stating that you plan to marry an American citizen in Athens, Greece, and asking if it will be necessary to re-marry when you come back to the United States, etc.

In reply to you letter will advise that a marriage performed according to the laws of Greece will be recognized in South Carolina. In other words if the marriage is a legal marriage in the State or Country where the marriage is performed, the State of South Carolina will recognize it as a legal marriage.

However, for your own satisfaction and as a matter of record it would be well to have the marriage recorded in South Carolina.

It will not be necessary to remarry in South Carolina,
