all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Glassy Mountain Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the center of Old Appalachian Highway, said iron pin being the northeast corner of the V. A. Henson Home Tract; thence with the V. A. Henson line and Old Appalachian Highway north 88° 44 min. west 63.8 feet to a tack in center line of Highway; thence north 64° 18 min. west 359.0 feet to a tack in Old Appalachian Highway; said tack being the southeast corner of Lot #1A, thence with the line of Lot 1A north 27° 44 min. east 80.4 feet to a stake, the northeast corner of Lot #1A; thence with the J. Calhoun line S. 74° 50 min. east 460.1 feet to an iron pin in the J. Calhoun line and running with the V. A. Henson line south 41° 35 min. west 142.2 feet passing the iron pin at 22.2 feet to the BEGINNING. Containing 1.17 acres, more or less, and being Lot #2A.
