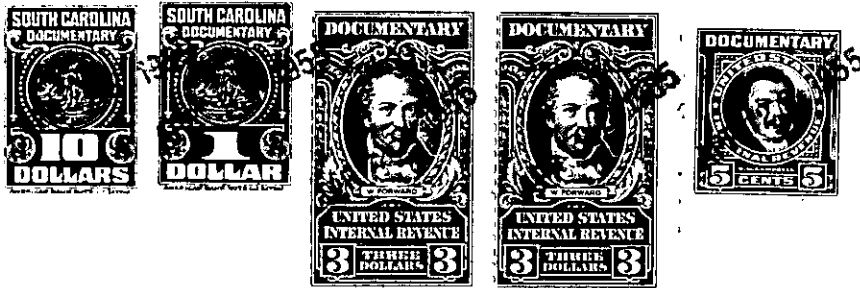


The consideration for the undivided one-half interest of Albert Melton Harris is \$2750.00 and the consideration for the entire interest in said property was \$5500.00 and the provision of the Court's Order is that this entire \$5500.00 shall be applied to the indebtedness on the property which was conveyed to Albert Melton Harris by deed dated December 31, 1954, recorded in Deed Book 518, Page 146, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County.

The entire consideration of \$5500.00 is to be paid by the grantee direct to the holder of the mortgage over the property in which an undivided one-half interest was conveyed to Albert Melton Harris, as above explained, and no money was paid to the Master. This was in accordance with the Court's Order.
