CHARTER  
BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE

WHEREAS,

JACK L. BLOOM AND CAROLYN C. McCONNELL  
BOTH OF GREENVILLE, S. C.

did on the 26th day of May, 1955, file with the Secretary of State a written Declaration, signed by themselves, setting forth:

FIRST: That their names and residences are as above given.

SECOND: That the name of the proposed corporation is YOUNG AGES, INC.

THIRD: That the principal place of business is Greenville, S. C.

FOURTH: That the general nature of the business which it is proposed to do is buy, sell, trade, exchange, manufacture, import, export, and generally to deal in and with, at wholesale and/or retail, goods, wares, merchandise, and clothing of every kind and nature; to conduct, operate, maintain, manage, lease, buy and sell clothing stores of every kind and nature; to acquire all such merchandise, supplies, fixtures, materials and other articles as may be necessary or incidental to such business; to hold, buy, acquire, lease, mortgage, and convey such real or personal property as may be necessary or incidental to such business; and generally to do any and all things necessary or incidental to such business and any and all things authorized or permitted under the laws of the State of South Carolina for a corporation to do or perform.

FIFTH: That the amount of the capital stock is Ten Thousand Five Hundred (\$10,500.00) Dollars payable in money, labor, or property

SIXTH: That the number of shares into which the capital stock is divided is Two Hundred Ten (210) of the par value of Fifty (\$50.00) per share - - - - - Dollars.

SEVENTH: That, after due notice, a meeting of the subscribers was held on the 25th day of May, 1955, at which a majority of all stock in value being present in person or by proxy, the following were elected directors: Jack L. Bloom and Carolyn C. McConnell.

EIGHTH: That subsequently there was elected as President, Jack L. Bloom ; as Vice-President, Carolyn C. McConnell ; as Secretary, Carolyn C. McConnell ; as Treasurer, Jack L. Bloom

NINTH: That all requirements of Title 12, Article 1, Chapter 2, Code of Laws of South Carolina, 1952, and all amendments thereto have been duly and fully complied with, 50 per cent. of the aggregate amount of the capital stock having been subscribed by bona fide subscribers, 20 per cent. of the capital stock subscribed having been paid to the Treasurer, and three days' public notice of the intention to file this Declaration with the Secretary of State having been given in

Greenville Piedmont a newspaper published in the County of Greenville

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. FRANK THORNTON, Secretary of State, by virtue of the authority in me vested by the aforesaid Code and Acts amendatory thereto, do hereby certify that the said Company has been fully organized according to the laws of South Carolina, under the name and for the purposes indicated in their written declaration, and that they are fully authorized to commence business under their charter; and I do hereby direct that a copy of this certificate be filed and recorded in the office of the Register of Mesne Conveyance or Clerk of Court in each county where such Corporation shall have a business office.
