

The Grantors covenant and agree with the United States of America and its assigns to pay all taxes and assessments on said land promptly when due and to warrant and defend said easement and rights to the United States of America and its assigns against the lawful claims and demands of all persons whomever, for the full term of said easement.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said easements and rights in said land unto the United States of America and its assigns in perpetuity from the date of this instrument.

The easement and rights hereby granted consist of the following rights over so much of the above described lands as lie within the standard zones hereinafter described.

The continuing perpetual right to cut to ground level and remove trees, bushes, shrubs, or any other perennial growth or undergrowth infringing upon or extending into or above the Glide Angle Plane and/or Transitional Plane hereinafter described.

The right to prohibit the future construction of buildings or other structures from infringing upon or extending into or above the Glide Angle Plane and/or Transitional Plane hereinafter described.

Reserving, however, to the Grantors, their heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns all right, title, interest, and privileges as may be exercised and enjoyed without interference with or abridgment of the easement and rights hereby granted.

The zones hereinbelow referred to are described as follows:

RUNWAY APPROACH ZONE

The runway approach zone is described as follows: Beginning at a point in the line of prolongation of the center line of the Northeast end of the North-East-South-West Runway of the Donaldson Air Force Base, level with and 1000 feet distant from the end of said runway; thence to the right forming an interior angle of $90^{\circ} 00' 00''$ with the line of prolongation of the center line of the runway, 750 feet to a point; thence to the left forming an interior angle of $97^{\circ} 07' 30''$ with the last mentioned line, 10,077.82 feet to a point; thence to the left forming an interior angle of $82^{\circ} 52' 30''$ with the last mentioned line, 4000 feet to a point; thence to the left forming an interior angle of 82°
