WHEREAS, our father, the late James Melborn Owens of Piedmont, South Carolina, died testate on the 17th day of February, 1951, and under the provisions of his will left his property to Lola Cox Owens, our mother; and

WHEREAS, we are desirous that the entire estate of our father shall be used up, if necessary, for the proper support and care of our mother;

NOW, THEREFORE, KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, Lola Mae O. Kelly of Williamston, South Carolina, Carl ... Owens of Route 3, Piedmont, South Carolina, U. C. Owens of Greenville, South Carolina, Bertha O. Middleton of Pelzer, South Carolina, and Ethel O. Middleton of Williamston, South Carolina, children of the said James Melborn Owens, constitute and appoint our brother, Roy J. Owens of Route 3, Piedmont, South Carolina, the executor under the will of our said father, our true and lawful attorney for us, and in our names and stead, to use, to ask, demand, sue for, levy, recover and receive all such sum and sums of money, debts, rents, goods, wares, dues, accounts, and other demands whatsoever, which are or shall be due, owing, or payable to us from the estate of our father.

We give and grant unto our said attorney, by these presents, full power, strength and authority, to have, use and take all lawful ways and means in our names for the recovery thereof; and upon the receipt of any such debts, dues, or sums of money afore-
