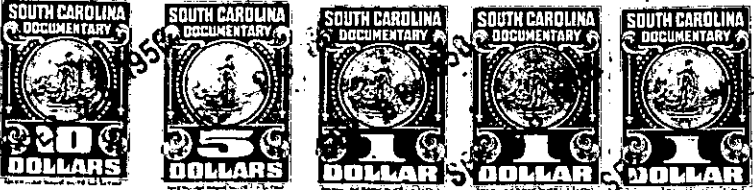
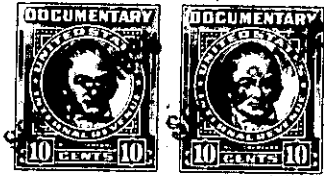
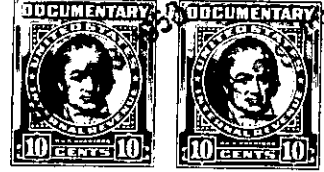

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That we, Kathryne R. Charles, indivi-
dually and as Executrix of the Estate of Jack Charles, deceased, Amy
Moore Charles and Jane Charles Hansley,

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of _____
Nine Thousand (\$9,000.00)----- Dollars

to _____ us _____ in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents
by Daisy B. Cash

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by
these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Daisy B. Cash

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Grove Township, Greenville
County, State of South Carolina, more particularly described as follows:

BEGINNING At an iron pin in the Augusta Road at W. F. Martin's corner,
and running thence N. 80.50 W. 16.67 chains to a stone; thence S. 7.45
W. 10.90 chains to a stone on Rodgers line; thence with said line,
N. 87.30 E. 17.88 chains to iron pin in Augusta Road; thence up said
road, N. 7.45 E. 7.41 chains to the beginning corner, and containing
fifteen acres, more or less.

Being the same property conveyed to John H. Charles (now deceased) by
Stephen Bass by deed dated June 14, 1943, recorded in the Office of the
Register of Mesne Conveyance for Greenville County in Deed Book 254,
Page 187. The said John H. Charles died testate on August 29, 1949,
leaving of force his last will and testament dated November 6, 1944,
on file in the Office of the Probate Court for Greenville County in
Apartment 576, Page 26. By the terms of said will, said John H.
Charles willed, devised and bequeathed unto the grantor herein, Amy
Moore Charles, his wife, all of his property of whatsoever kind and
nature and wheresoever situate, real, personal and mixed, for and during
the term of her natural life, and upon her death to the grantor, Jane
Charles Hansley, his daughter, and his son, Jack Charles, now deceased.
That the said Jack Charles died testate on the 4th day of February, 1956
leaving of force his last will and testament dated November 6, 1944 on
file in the Office of the Probate Court for Greenville County, S. C., in
Apartment 648, File 37, by the terms of which he willed, devised and
bequeathed unto the grantor herein, Kathryne R. Charles, all his property,
real, personal and mixed, owned by him at the time of his death.
