The land herein referred to lies partly in Green River Township, Henderson County, North Carolina, and partly in Saluda Township, County of Greenville, and State of South Carolina, and is all the land owned by M. M. Russell at the time of his death in said counties and townships and is more particularly described, as follows:

All of my undivided interest in a certain piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being partly in the County of Greenville and in the State aforesaid, and part in Henderson County, North Carolina, and is my prorata share as one of the M. M. Russell heirs in the land owned by M. M. Russell at the time of his death and later owned by J. M. Bell at the time of his death and is on head waters of Fall Creek, head waters of North Saluda River and on head waters of Pacolet River and bounded by lands of R. P. Ward, R. W. I.
