And I hereby declare that in the absence of such a written, recorded revocation any act or thing lawfully done hereunder by my said attorney shall be binding on myself, my heirs, legal and personal representatives, and assigns, whether the same shall have been done before or after my death, unless and until reliable intelligence or notice thereof shall have been received by my said attorney; and whether or not I, the grantor of this instrument, shall have been reported or listed, either officially or otherwise, as "missing in action" as that phrase is used in Naval parlance, it being the intentment that such status designation shall not bar my attorney from fully and completely exercising and continuing to exercise any and all powers and rights herein granted, and that such report of "missing in action" shall neither constitute nor be interpreted as constituting notice of my death nor operate to revoke this instrument.
