of South Carolina, near the City of Greenville, known and designated as
Lot No. 12 of Airport Village Farms according to plat made by M. H.
Woodward, Engineer, and Piedmont Engineering Service dated April 23,
1947; and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on Jimmy Doolittle Road 564.6 feet from the
southwestern intersection of said Jimmy Doolittle Road and Airport
Road; thence with said Jimmy Doolittle Road S. 15-30 W. 100 feet to an
