REVOCATION OF POWER OF ATTORNEY

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS:

That, whereas I, Captain Andrew P. Lubic, 0996456, presently assigned to Headquarters and Headquarters Company, 47th Ordnance Group, APO 154, New York, N.Y., did, on or about December 1954 by a certain instrument in writing, to wit: a General Power of Attorney, designate my wife, Doris Sybil Lubic, as my true and lawful attorney, and did by said written instrument empower her to act for me, in my name and stead in any and all matters and transactions as fully as I, myself could do.

NOW THEREFORE, I, the said Andrew P. Lubic, do hereby revoke, countermand and make void, said instrument, to wit: a General Power of Attorney, and all powers and authorities therein and thereby given and contained and do hereby disavow and disaffirm any and all acts done or which shall be done, and any and all matters and transactions which have been done or which shall be done or entered into by virtue or under the power of said instrument in any manner whatsoever subsequent to the execution of this instrument.
