of Greenville aforesaid, by virtue of the aforesaid decree, and upon receipt of \$3000.00

HAVE GRANTED, conveyed and released, and by these presents, DO GRANT, convey and release  
unto the said Claude S. Hall and Lucille B. Hall

"All that piece, parcel and tract of land in Saluda Township, County  
and State aforesaid, a part of the land conveyed to E. L. Cox by deed from  
Robert H. Eppes, adjoining land now or formerly of Paul Gilreath, Luther  
Harris and Dave Reynolds and having the following courses and distances,  
to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin in road, thence running S. 20 E. <sup>143</sup>2.17 to a  
bend in road; thence S. 26 E. 2.32 to a bend; thence S. 49 E. 4.65 to an  
iron pin in fork of roads; thence N. 22½ E. 8.60 to an iron pin; thence,  
N. 18½ W. 12.37 to a stake on branch; thence up said branch S. 68½ W. 1.90  
to a bend; thence S. 81 W. 2.20 to a poplar; thence S. 38 W. 7.20 to a pine  
(x3); thence S. 31½ E. 6.68 feet to the beginning corner, and containing
