

All that certain piece, parcel or lot of land in Gantt Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, on the eastern side of Knox Street known and designated as Lot 64 and adjoining (or northern) one-half of lot 63 as shown on a plat of Glendale Heights recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book KK at page 143, and having, according to this plat, the following metes and bounds:
BEGINNING at an iron pin on the eastern side of Knox Street, which iron pin is 120 feet south of the concrete monument at the intersection of Knox Street and Driver Avenue, at the joint front corner of lots 64 and 65 and running thence with the line of lot 65 N. 83-15 E. 130 feet to an iron pin at the rear corner of lot 32; thence with the rear lines of lots 32 and 33 S. 6-45 E. 105 feet to a point; thence along a new line which bisects lot 63 S. 83-15 W. 130 feet to a point on the eastern edge of Knox Street; thence with the eastern edge of Knox Street N. 6-45 W. 105 feet to the point of beginning.
