## PURFOSES

The purposes for which the Corporation is organized are:

- A. To accept, receive, maintain, and administer a find or finds of real property or personal property, or both, and, utject to the restrictions and limitations rereinafter set forth, to use, dorate, and arrly the whole or any part of the inc me therefrom and the principal thereof exclusively for charitable, religious, scientific, literary, humanitarian, or educational purposes, either directly or by contributions to organizations duly authorized to carry on charitable, religious, scientific, literary, humanitarian, or educational activities, without is-crimination because of race, creed, or color; provided, however, that no part of such income or such principal shall be conti-buted to any organization whose net a rrings or income, or any part thereof, inure to the perefit of any private stareholder or individual or any part of the octivities of which consist of carrying on propaganda or otherwise sitemsting to influe ce legislation and which participates in or interverse in (including the publishing, handling or distributing of st tements, any political campaign on behalf of any cancidate for public criice; provided further that no part of the net earnings of the Gor oration shall increase the constant of the const tion shall inure to the benefit of any ember, director, co officer of the Corporation or any private shareholder or indivious? (except that reasonable commensation may be paid for services rendered to or for the corporation affecting one or more of its purposes), and that no member, director, or officer of the Cor; oration, or any private shareholder or individual, shall be entitled to share in the distribution of any of the corcorate assets upon dissolution of the Corporat in and thit runsit of the activities of the Corporation shall consist of the carrying on of proraganda or othe wise attemnting to influe ce 'egislation or participating or intervening in (including the publication, handling, or distributi on of st-tements) any political carraion on behalf of any candidate for pullic office.
- B. To accept, acquire, receive, take, and hold by homest, devise, grant, gift, purchase, exchange, lease, transfer, assignment, judicial order or decree, or otherwise, for any of its objects and purchase, any property, both real and rersonal, of whatever kind, nature, or description and wherever situated, and to sell, exchange, convey, mortgage, lease, transfer, or otherwise discose of any such property, both real and personal, at any time and from time to time hereafter as may be considered advisable by the board of Directors of the Corporation, so ject to such limitations as may be prescribed by law.
- C. To borrow money, and from time to time to make, accent, indorse, execute, and issue bonds, debentures, promissory makes, bills of exchange, and other oblications of the Cor oration for money borrowed or in payment for property acquired or for any of the other nurposes of the Corporation, and to secure the ray ent of any such obligation by mart the, the decay indenture, agreement, or other instrument of trust, or by other lien upon, assignment of, or agreement in regard to all or any part of a property, richts or privileges of the Corporation wherever situated, whether now owned or hereafter to be acquired.
