

Nannie Jeffries Allen died testate on May 28, 1942, as will appear by referece to Apartment 452, File 7, in the Office of the Judge of Probate for Greenville County.

Walter H. Allen, the son of C. O. Allen and Nannie Jeffries Allen, died testate on March 26, 1943, while the trust created by Item V of the C. O. Allen will was still in existence, leaving as his heirs at law and devisees, his wife, Effie Loyd Allen, and his daughter and only child, Loyd Allen, now Loyd Allen Beattie, Reference Apartment 461, File 8, in the Office of the Judge of Probate for Greenville County.

The Executors/Trustees named in the will of C. O. Allen and subsequently appointed were Walter H. Allen, Winfield T. Potter and The First National Bank of Greenville, S. C. Walter H. Allen died as set forth above, and Winfield T. Potter died on March 8, 1949 (see Apartment 566, File 13, Office of Judge of Probate for Greenville County, S. C.), leaving The First National Bank of Greenville as sole surviving Executor/Trustee. Subsequently, The First National Bank of Greenville was merged into The South Carolina National Bank, which is now serving as Successor to the said First National Bank.
