

The testimony of the plaintiff was not corroborated, but the Court is convinced that collusion between the parties does not exist and therefore that no corroboration is necessary. See Brown v. Brown, 56 S.E. 2d 330.

In accordance with the foregoing findings, it is, therefore, ORDERED, That the plaintiff, Selene R. Russell, be, and she hereby is, granted a divorce a vinculo matrimonii of and from the defendant, William E. Russell.
