SENERAL WARRANTY DEED

PET DAIRY PRODUCTS COMPANY, a Delaware corporation,

with principal offices in the City of Johnson City, State of Tennessee, Party of the First Part, and

PET MILK COMPANY, a Delaware corporation,

with principal offices in the City of St. Louis, State of Missouri, Party of the Second Part.

WITNESSETH, that the said Party of the First Part, for and in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and other good and valuable consideration paid by the said Party of the Second Part, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, given, sold, remised, released, warranted, conveyed, transferred and confirmed, and by these presents does grant, bargain, give, sell, remise, release, warrant, convey, transfer and confirm unto the said Party of the Second Part, the following described real property, situated in the County of Greenville and State of South Carolina, to-wit:

All that piece, parcel or lot of land in the City of Greenville known and designated as a portion of Lot # 11, Block I, of the Stone Land Company, and as shown on a recent plat entitled "Property of Walter W. Goldsmith, et al.", made by Dalton E. Neves, May 1954 with addition and revision of plat November 1954, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to wit:

Beginning at an iron pin on the West side of Column Street (formerly Miller Street) at corner of property heretofore conveyed by Walter W.
