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JOHN K. EARLE, JR., WILLIAM H. EARLE and DAVID F. EARLE conveyed to G. W. STRICKLAND and J. VANCE FAULKNER a tract of land by deed recorded in the RMC Office for Greenville County in Deed Book 608 at page 276. Thereafter, G. W. STRICKLAND and J. EARLE and DAVID F. EARLE by deed recorded in said RMC Office in Deed Book 680 at page 305. In this deed they directed GEORGE F.
