

building plans, specifications and plot plan showing the proposed type of construction, exterior design and location of such residence have been approved in writing by the Architectural Committee as to conformity and harmony of external design and consistence of plan with existing residences on other lots in the subdivision and as to the location of the structure with respect to topography and finished ground elevation. In addition, a landscape development plan must likewise be submitted and approved by the Architectural Committee showing the location of proposed fences, boundary or patio walls, hedges, shrubbery, walkways, driveways, parking areas and important trees.

(3) In order to prevent duplication of buildings or improvements to be constructed in this subdivision, the Committee is vested with full authority to approve or disapprove plans for the construction of any building or improvement with its major features so similar to an existing building or improvements as to be considered a substantial duplication thereof in the discretion of the Committee. The Architectural Committee shall further have the right to refuse to approve any such plans, specifications, plot plans or landscape plans which in its opinion and discretion are not suitable or desirable and in so passing upon such plans, specifications, plot plans or landscape plans, the Committee shall take into consideration the suitability of the proposed building or other improvement, the materials of which it is to be built, whether or not it is in harmony with the surroundings and what effect it will have on other residences already constructed and what effect it will have on the outlook from adjacent or neighboring property.

(4) In the event that the Committee fails to approve or disapprove such plans within thirty (30) days after they have been submitted to it, or if no suit to enjoin the erection or alteration of such building or improvement has been commenced
