BEGINNING at a point on Coffee Street approximately 213 feet 7 inches from the west side of Richardson Street and running thence in a westerly direction with Coffee Street, 45 feet to a stake; thence in a southerly direction along the line of property now or formerly owned by Wilson Cook Estate, 153 feet to a point; thence in an easterly direction parallel with Coffee Street with the line of property now or formerly owned by Ann White, 45 feet to a stake; thence in a northerly direction along the line of property now or formerly owned by Crosskeys, 153 feet to the beginning corner.
