Know all Men by these presents, That

We, T. C. Stone, E. E. Stone, and Harriet M. Stone, individually and as trustee for E. E. Stone

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of

Five (\$5.00) Dollars and love and affection Dollars

to us paid by Eugene E. Stone, Jr.

in the State aforesaid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Eugene E. Stone, Jr., his heirs and assigns forever:

All that certain piece, parcel, or lot of land situate, lying and being in the State of South Carolina, County of Greenville, and within the corporate limits of the City of Greenville, being known and designated as Lot No. 56, of a subdivision known as Stone Lake Heights, Section No. 2, as shown on plat thereof prepared by Piedmont Engineering Service, July 15, 1953, and recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Plat Book W, at page 87, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the western edge of Lake Forest Drive, joint front corner of Lots 55 and 56, and running thence along the joint line of said lots, S. 77-50 W. 245.4 feet to a point on the margin of Stone Lake, which point is witnessed by an iron pin 5 feet back on line; thence along the margin of Stone Lake, following the meanders thereof, a traverse line of which is S. 7-22 E. 202.7 feet to a point on the margin of said lake, the joint rear corners of Lots 56 and 57; thence along the joint line of said lots, N. 52-25 E. 261 feet to an iron pin on the western edge of Lake Forest Drive; thence along the western edge of Lake Forest Drive, following the curvature thereof, the chord of which is N. 6-23 E. 97.1 feet to the beginning corner.

Together with all rights and privileges in and to the bed and waters of Stone Lake as are accorded by law to a riparian owner, including, without being limited to, the right and privilege, as appurtenant to said lot, to go upon and use the waters of said lake for the purpose of engaging in normal aquatic sports such as boating, fishing, and swimming, and the further right to construct and maintain a dock or landing which does not extend farther than 15 feet from the waters edge and is so located as not to interfere with the reasonable use of Stone Lake by any other riparian owner.

This conveyance is subject to restrictions and protective covenants recorded in the R. M. C. office for Greenville County in Deed Vol. 483, at page 355, and is also subject to certain easements or rights-of-way for the installation and maintenance of public utilities, which easements also appear of record in said R. M. C. office.
