KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS that we, A. P. ADAMS and FRED ADAMS, for and in consideration of ONE THOUSAND and NO/100 (\$1,000.00) DOLLARS, the said sum to be equally divided between us, the same to us in hand paid, receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, do this day grant, bargain and sell to GREENVILLE COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA, its successors and assigns forever an easement or right to use the property of the grantors hereinafter described in the following particulars, to-wit:

Greenville County is hereby given an easement, right and use of defendants' property, the same to be used for the overflowage of water from a creek, said overflowage to be the result of a flooding or a raising of the water in said creek and leaving the banks of said creek and flowing over the property of the grantors. The said grantors agree to hold Greenville County harmless from any and all liability of any nature from damages caused by the flooding of the creek that flows adjacent to the property herein described.

It being further understood that Greenville County will exercise all reasonable care to prevent such flooding or overflowage of grantors' property.

The property covered by this easement is described as follows:

ALL that piece, parcel or tract of land situate, lying and being in Greenville County, South Carolina, known and designated as Lots Nos. 13 and 14 as shown by plat entitled Property of J. H. Bayne, said plat being recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book H at Page 100, and having, according to said plat, the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the northern side of an unnamed street (now known as Wood Street) joint front corner of Lots 12 and 13 and running thence N. 61-36 W. 117.9 feet; thence S. 36-33 E. 90 feet; thence S. 64-32 E. 112.3 feet to said unnamed street; thence along said street, N. 41-12 E. 85 feet to the beginning point. Being the same property conveyed to A. P. Adams
