ALL OF OUR RIGHT, TITLE AND INTEREST In

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Gnatt Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, and being known and designated as Lot No. 6 in the division of the real estate of Jane Lewers, Deceased, and more fully described as follows:

BEGINNING in a point in the center of the Road leading from White Horse Road to the Augusta Road, on line of land of Charles Rogers Estate running thence, along said line N. 5-10 W., 386.5 Feet corner of Lot No. 7; thence with line of lot No. 7, N. 89 W., 136 Feet corner of Lots No. 5 and 6; thence along line of lot No. 5., S. 3-30 E., 451.7 Feet to a stake in the road; thence along the road N. 66-45 E., 158 Feet to the beginning corner, and containing 1.50 acres more or less.
