(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Louis Cox Wright for life, Ellen Cox Dunlap for life, Ruth C. Finley for life and Mary Cox McCorkle for life, with remainder in fee simple to the final survivor thereof, her heirs and assigns forever,

all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina, consisting of two lots located about two and one-half miles west of the old Greenville County Courthouse near the Easley Bridge Road, and being a portion of lots Nos. 20 and 22 of Block C on plat of property of Julia D. Charles, which plat is recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book E, page 209 and having the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at a stake on Gordon Street, which stake is 150 feet east of the intersection of Gordon Street and Texas Avenue, and running thence with Gordon Street N 71 E 50 feet to a stake, corner of the other property of S. F. Floyd; thence in a southerly direction 160 feet to a stake on line of lot No. 18, which point is 87.23 feet in a westerly direction from the common corner of Lots Nos. 18, 19, 20 and 21, and running thence with the line of Lot No. 18 S 71 W 45 feet to a stake; thence N 22-10 W 160 feet to a stake at the beginning corner.

This being the lot inherited by the Grantors from their mother, Nancy E. Cox, who died intestate in 1936, and who had previously received this property by deed of J. R. Richardson on September 3, 1929, recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, South Carolina in Deed Book J, at page 212.

And all that certain piece, parcel or lot of land situate, lying and being in the County of Greenville, State of South Carolina, on the south side of Gordon Street in Greenville Township, said lot fronting 50 feet on Gordon Street and bounded on the west by property now or formerly belonging to J. R. Richardson, on the east by property now or formerly belonging to James H. Woodside, on the north by Gordon Street, and on the south by Lot No. 18. Said lot has a depth of 160 feet on each side measured from Gordon Street, and a rear width of 44 feet, and is known and designated as a portion of Lots Nos. 22 and 20, according to a plat recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book E, at page 209.

This being the lot inherited by the Grantors from their mother, Nancy E. Cox, who died intestate in 1936, and who had received this property by deed of George Cox dated August 3, 1935, and recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County,

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
