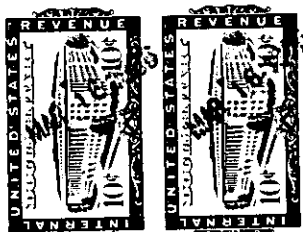


thence N. 20-45 E. 2.00 chains to a stone in swamp; the old Turner-Weaver corner; thence with the old Weaver line, N. 75 E. 4.97 chains to an iron pipe in road; thence along and with said road as follows: S. 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ E. 1.29 chains, S. 27 E. 9.40 chains, S. 10 $\frac{1}{4}$ W. 1.89 chains, and S. 39 W. 3.68 chains to the beginning, containing 17.32 acres, more or less, and being all of that tract of land as conveyed to the grantor, Pearl McMillan Neves by R.L.
