KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That WE, Charles M. Holcombe, Catherine H. Hatley, Robert E. Holcombe, Margaret H. Cantrell, Ernestine H. Hill, James H. Holcombe, Jean H. Robinson, Thomas Carroll Holcombe, and Edward P. Holcombe

in the State aforesaid, in consideration of the sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) and Mutual Property Division Dollars

to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by John J. Holcombe

(the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said John J. Holcombe, his Heirs and Assigns forever:

~~all that piece parcel or lot of land in~~ Township  
~~County State of South Carolina~~

ALL that certain tract of land, with the improvements thereon, situated in the County of Greenville State of South Carolina, containing 4.63 Acres, being known and designated as Tract No. 10 in accordance with plat made for E. H. Holcombe, dated May, 1966, by C. O. Riddle and being recorded in the R. M. C. Office for Greenville County in Plat Book \_\_\_\_\_ at Page \_\_\_\_\_, and being more fully described in accordance with said plat, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin in the center of proposed road, joint front corner with Tract 9 and running thence along Tract 9 S. 39-27 W. 317.9 feet to iron pin; thence N. 52-06 W. 506.6 feet to iron pin; thence N. 57-50 E. 644.3 feet to point near center of proposed road; thence along the center of proposed road S. 7-52 E. 412.5 feet to point in center of proposed road, being the point of beginning.

This being a portion of the property as was deeded to Maggie Holcombe by deed recorded in Deed Book 115, at Page 93, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, and the said Maggie Holcombe departed this life intestate on or about July 5th, 1941 leaving Edward H. Holcombe, her husband, and the above named parties as her sole surviving heirs, except Willie Mae E. Pridgin, a daughter, who died intestate May 26th, 1965 in Augusta, Georgia, leaving no children and as her sole Heirs the Grantors and Grantee herein, and her husband, J. G. Pridgin, who conveyed his interest to the above party by deed recorded in Deed Book 777, Page 79, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County

Grantee to pay 1966 County Taxes. This conveyance, along with other conveyances of even date nullify and void clause in prior deeds, creating an off set to various parties in the final settlement of Maggie Holcombe estate, and all grantors and grantees hereby acknowledge equal division with no remaining indebtedness due by any party.
