


TITLE TO REAL ESTATE



KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS That we, W.M. Tapp, James Hoyt Tapp, Broadus D. Tapp, Garland G. Tapp, T.J. Tapp, Gordon L. Tapp, Miller C. Tapp, Samuel J. Tapp, Gladys T. Mosteller, Rosa T. Mosteller and Mary T. Sudduth, in consideration of the sum of Thirty-five Hundred (\$3,500.00) Dollars to us in hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by Herman L. Gibbs and Gladys W. Gibbs (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Herman L. Gibbs and Gladys W. Gibbs and their heirs and assigns forever:

All that parcel or tract of land in Oneal Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, located about four miles north of the City of Greer and near the Washington Baptist Church, lying on the east side of the Gibson-Mosteller Road, sometimes known as the Wingo Road, on the northwest side of road leading from the Gibson-Mosteller Road to the Jordan Road at the old Line School place and Miles Bruce place, and lying on the south side of a County road which connects these two highways, being triangular in shape, containing eleven (11) acres, more or less, and being shown as Lot No. 13 in Block 1 on Sheet 631.5 of the Greenville County Tax Map System, and having the following courses and distances:
