BEGINNING at a nail in the center of Bennett's Bridge Road (now Roper Mountain Road) at joint front corner of Tract 3 and 4, thence along the center of said road, S. 87-58 W., 164.2 feet to a nail; thence still with the center of said road, N. 78-55 W., 664.6 feet to a nail in the center of road at center of branch; thence down the center of the branch, the traverse line being N. 27 W., 205 feet to a point in center of branch; thence still with the center of the branch, the traverse line being N. 35- $15\ W.$, $185\ \text{feet to a point in the center of another branch on the Northwest side of}$ Rocky Creek; thence up the center of said branch, the traverse line being N.60-18 W., 486 feet to a stake at corner of property now or formerly of J. W. Bagwell; thence along said Bagwell line, N. 16-09 W., 1382.7 feet to an iron pin; thence with the line of property now or formerly of Bomar, N. 77-51 E., 832 feet to an iron pin at the corner of property now or formerly of Harold B.
