Pace (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged), have granted, bargained sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said JAMES E. PACE AND DONNA J. PACE AND THEIR HEIRS AND ASSIGNS FOREVER:

ALL OF OUR RIGHT, TITLE AND INTEREST IN AND TO:

All that parcel or tract of land in Glassy Mountain Township of Greenville County, South Carolina, lying on the west side of the Glassy Mountain Road, a highway leading from State Highway No. 101 near the Blue Ridge High School to State Highway No. 11 at the Glassy Mountain Baptist Church, bounded on the north by lands of R. Randolph Loftis formerly Fred C. Hughes, on the east by said highway and lands of Dr. Joe $^{\rm M}_{\bullet}$ Rogers and Lewis Gosnell, on the south and west by Arnold E. Emery and R.
