of any such goods or services, and in no case shall it be required to see to the application of any such funds so paid. Any income or principal so retained by the Trustee, and any income therefrom, which is not expended or applied under the provisions of this Article, shall be paid over to such beneficiary upon attaining majority, or if he or she shall sooner die, to his or her estate. In holding any principal or income for any minor, the Trustee shall have all of the powers, discretionary and otherwise, hereinafter conferred upon it.

III.

In addition to the powers conferred upon him (or it) by statute or general rules of law, and with the direction that a grant of specific powers shall not be construed as a limitation of general powers granted herein or by statute or law, the Trustee is specifically authorized and empowered:

- (1) To retain, in the form received, any property or interest in property transferred to the trust when created hereunder;
- (2) To invest funds of the trust created hereunder in stocks, bonds, notes, debentures, or other securities, or property, real or personal (including any common or commingled fund maintained by the Trustee), notwithstanding such securities or property may not be eligible investments for fiduciaries under statutory or general law, it being the intention of the Grantor that the Trustee shall have the power to make such investments as he, in his unrestricted judgment, may deem best, and to register and hold any securities or property constituting a part of the trust created hereunder in the name of any nominee or agent of the Trustee;
- (3) To sell, resell, exchange, re-exchange, convey, reconvey, assign, or otherwise transfer or dispose of, any property, real or personal, at any time held by him as part of the trust fund established hereunder, for cash or other property, or upon credit, in such manner and upon such terms and conditions as he may deem best, and no person dealing with him shall be required to see to the application of any moneys paid to him;
