Enoch Cothran, an undivided one-sixth (1/6) interest each; and unto
Mark Albert Cothran and Christel Marie Cothran, an undivided one-
twelfth interest each, in and to

" all that piece, parcel or lot of land in Dunklin Township, Greenville

County, State of South Carolina containing $36\frac{1}{2}$ acres, more or less described
as follows: BEGINNING on a stone 3X with tract of J. G. Cothran, on
