have granted, bargained, sold and released, and by these presents do grant, bargain, and release unto the said

JOE ALLEN LOOPER, his heirs and assigns, all my right, title and interest in and to: ALL that piece, parcel or tract of land lying and being situate on the Northerly side of Old Georgia Road, in Grove Township, Greenville County, South Carolina, containing 1.77 acres, and having, according to plat of property of Bailey S. Looper, dated March 1966, as revised August 22, 1969, by C. O. Riddle, R.L.S., the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

BEGINNING at an iron pin in the center of Old Georgia Road in the Southeast corner of property of Grantor, which iron pin is 289.8 feet Northeast of the East boundary of electric tower line and running thence N. 13.56 W., 342.2 feet to an iron pin at rear line of property of the Grantor; thence N. 65-50 E., 192.7 feet to an iron pin in un-named dirt road in line of William B. Hall (or formerly) property; thence S. 30-32 E., 300 feet to a point in the center line of Old Georgia Road; thence along the center line of Old Georgia Road as the center line, on an angle, the courses and distances of which are: S. 54-53 W., 100 feet to an iron pin; S. 57-51 W., 100 feet to an iron pin; S. 62-11 W., 90 feet to an iron pin at the point of beginning.

The above described property is conveyed subject to existing easements, rights of way, reservations, and restrictions, if any.

As more fully shown in Apartment 1507, File 5, Records of the Probate County for Greenville County, S. C., Bailey S. Looper died testate on March 23, 1978. In Item II of his Will, he devised to his wife, Edna A. Looper, for and during her natural lifetime, the two (2) acre tract and any improvements thereon situate, said tract being described on plat of my property. The aforesaid revised plat defines a tract of 1.77 acres upon which the homeplace is situate and a 1.82 acre tract, conveyed by the Testator to Della Ruth L. Hartman and Paul H. Hartman by deed dated September 2, 1969, recorded in Deed Volume 875, at Page 215. In order to dissolve any ambiguity or misunderstanding, the Grantor conveys to her brother, the Grantee herein, by this Quitclaim Deed, any right, title or interest she now has or may in the future have in the above described property.

The above described property is part of the same conveyed to Bailey S. Looper and Margaret B. Looper by deed of W. M. Allen, dated November 6, 1934, and recorded on November 10, 1934 in Deed Volume 178, at Page 232, R. M. C. Office for Greenville County, S. C. The said Margaret B. Allen Looper died intestate in Greenville County, S. C. on October 31, 1964, leaving her husband, Bailey S. Looper, Joe Allen Looper, her son and Della Ruth Looper Hartman, her daughter as her sole surviving heirs at law and next of kin. By deed dated May 22, 1967, recorded on May 24, 1967, in Deed Volume 820, at Page 302, the said Joe Allen Looper conveyed to Bailey S. Looper all of his right, title and interest in and to the aforesaid tract. By deed dated May 1, 1967 recorded on June 2, 1967, in Deed Volume 821, at Page 70 Della Ruth Looper Hartman conveyed to Bailey S. Looper all of her right,

title and interest in and to the aforesaid tract.

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
