Property owners who own in excess of one or more acres may keep on their property a horse or horses so long as the horses are housed in a building suitable to the afore-mentioned Committee. Horses must be personal riding animals. No one may keep a horse for a fee on any lot. Any barn built for the purpose of housing horses shall be at least 100 feet from the front lot line and no closer than fifty (50) feet to any side lot line.

- along the front of any lot and nearer to the front lot line, than the building set-back line having a height or more than four (4) feet. This restriction may be waived by the Architectural Committee if the lot is to contain horses and in such event any fence in front of any residence must be approved by the afore-mentioned Committee. Any fence on any lot must be approved by the Architectural Committee unless the fence will not be visible from any road.
- 16. All residences must have a driveway so that no cars shall be parked along the street other than at times when social gatherings may be taking place and there is insufficient space to keep the cars off of the street.
- 17. No trucks, other than recreational vehicles, larger than pick-up size, or trucks containing more than six tires on the ground may be parked on any lot, unless said trucks and trailers are temporarily on the lot for moving purposes.
- 18. No refuge, waste, barrels, equipment, machinery, tractors, other than garden tractors sued solely not for hire, on the owners property, may be stored on any lot other than temporarily for construction.
- 19. No signs of any kind may be erected on any lot, except realtor signs for sale of homes.
- 20. All mail box construction must be submitted to Architectural Committee along with building plans.
