the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, HAVE GRANTED, bargained, sold and released, and by these Presents DO GRANT, bargain, sell and release unto the said Eugene E. Stone, Jr., and Charles B. Stone:

"ALL that piece, parcel or lot of land in Greenville Township, Greenville County, State of South Carolina, in the City of Greenville, on the northern side of Pendleton Street, being known as Lot Number Three (No. 3) as shown on plat of property of McNeill Brothers, made by Dalton & Neves, Engineers, dated June 1952, and being more particularly described as follows:
