IN TRUST, NEVERTHELESS, FOR THE FOLLOWING USES AND PURPOSES:

To pay all appropriate costs and expenses, as the trustees shall determine, in connection with such selling, transferring and conveying and after deducting all said costs and expenses to promptly pay, from the first net proceeds coming into the trust, the sum of One Thousand and 00/100 (\$1,000.00) Dollars to my daughter-in-law Marjorie Carson Duncan. All remaining net proceeds from each and every sale shall be promptly divided after each sale equally among my following named five children:

  - 2. Carl A. Duncan
