effecting Public Welfare are constantly rendering Trusts created for specific objects superfluous, and literal compliance with the terms unwise, impractical, or impossible; and that while in some jurisdictions the Courts are clothed with power to direct that such Trust shall be administered in a manner most effectual to accomplish their general purpose, with regard to and free from any specific restriction, limitation, or direction contained therein, the necessary Court proceedings always involve delay and expense and are frequently contested; and recognizing that society may at some time in the future change its method or mode of disposing of its dead do hereby grant unto the Trustees authority to change or conform with the prevailing and religious acceptable method of care, or other disposition of its Cemetery.
